Practice Assignments:

Assignments are designed as a reinforcement of classroom instruction. All assignments will be turned in the following class meeting by the end of the school day. Time might be given in class to work on assignments. You will be expected to use this time to complete the assignment; however you may need to finish it at home. *All assignments must be written neatly in pencil with problem written and ALL WORK SHOWN!* No Exceptions. Late Work will not be accepted.

Quizzes:

Quizzes will be given in between chapter exams. No make-up quizzes will be given. I will drop your lowest quiz score at the end of the semester. Notes may not be used on exams, unless otherwise stated. *Quiz missed due to an absence must be made up within 1 week before or after school.*

Exams & Projects:

Chapter exams will be given at the end of each chapter. A study guide will be provided at least 1 class period prior to exam. Notes may not be used on exams, unless otherwise stated. *Students may retake up to 2 tests per semester for full credit <u>An exam missed due to an absence must be made up before or after school</u> within 1 week of when the exam was assigned. Projects will be assigned at least once a semester. You will be given at least 2 weeks to work on each project. A grading rubric will be provided at the time each project is assigned. Late projects will not be accepted under ANY circumstances.*

Final:

The semester final exam will cover all topics studied during the semester and will be given during finals week. It will make up 20% of your final grade

Grading Policy:

Attendance:

Absent Work:

An "Absent Binder" will be available for students, located in the back of the classroom. Student's should utilize Before & After school office hours to help aid them in material no understood due to an absence. Unless other arrangements are made, assignments must be made up. You have as many days as you were absent. <u>A quiz or exam missed due to an absence must be made up before or after school within 1</u> <u>week</u>. If you are ever out of class due to a school activity (field trip, sports, etc), you are not excused from any of the work.

Extra Help:

I am available to provide extra help **before school, after school, and by appointment**. Please come in as soon as you feel that you are beginning to struggle with a concept. It is your responsibility to seek help from the teacher. Do not wait until the morning of a test to get help for an entire chapter. Cheating Policy:

Cheating is strictly prohibited! Students are encouraged to work together on assignments and projects. However, students must turn in original work, not copied work. If students are found or suspected of cheating on homework, a project, a quiz, or an exam, the students involved will receive a zero until they have talked with me. At that time the students involved <u>may or may not</u> be given an opportunity to make up the assignment.

Student Responsibilities:

Everyone has the right to learn. In order for that to happen, there must be order in the classroom. We will prepare ourselves for a successful adult life by cultivating habits expected of an adult in our classroom. Every student must be responsible for following the rules below or else he/she will be infringing on the rights and comforts of others.

- 1. Attend Class <u>regularly</u> and be seated in your desk before the tardy bell rings.
